Understanding, evaluating and managing exposure scenarios

What is an extended Safety Data Sheet (SDS)? What are exposure scenarios? How should exposure scenarios (ES) be managed within an extended SDS to ensure regulatory compliance?

Hazardous substances registered under REACH require an assessment of risk for uses of the substance and their resulting mixtures to ensure 'suitability for use'. Exposure estimates resulting from these risk scenarios form part of the chemical safety report (CSR) that needs to be communicated to all end users through the extended SDS.

This one-day certificated CLC module aims to cover the basic principles of exposure assessment, dealing with the technical application of the extended SDS whilst ensuring regulatory compliance.

Who should attend?

The course is suitable for those with an understanding of the requirements of a Safety Data Sheet who work in a technical or customer-facing role with responsibility for devising both SDSs and extended SDSs, risk management or regulatory compliance.

The course will also suit those with an understanding and/or some experience of extended Safety Data Sheets who need to understand the underpinning regulation. The course may also be of interest to Senior Managers with responsibility for organisational reputation and risk management.
